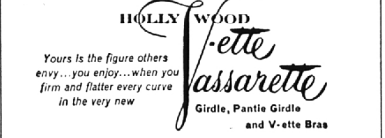

Bermuda Vacation

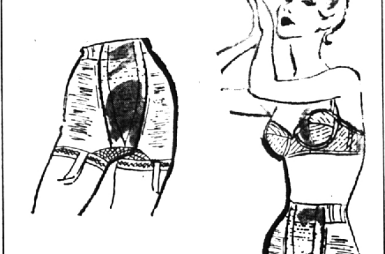

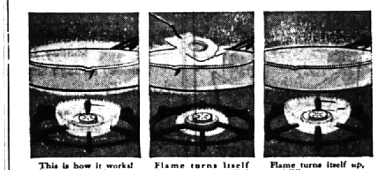

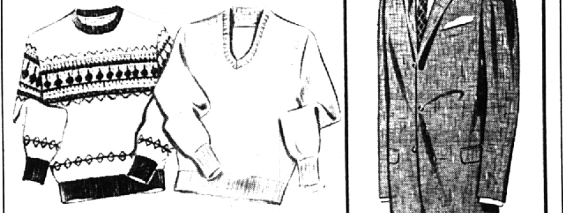
