## 'Sweet and Sour' Was the Latter

Sweet and Sour starred Melvyn Douglas recently in the intriguing melodrama that serves as the Northland playhouse. The play, a pre-Broadway try-out, dealt disappointingly with three months in the lives of a Jewish family at the turn of the century.

Douglas, as the domineering father, is a man of many faces. He struggled in a role with plenty of opportunity for verbose exposition. But it failed almost completely to provide for the creation of a full dramatic personality.

Despite his many conversations with God it was difficult to believe that this crusty patriarchal figure really had any delicate feelings other than making of God a sounding-board for his own prejudices. His subsequent loss and final recovery of faith thus had little emotional impact.

NOR is it easy to believe that four daughters could remain in one home long to a father who reveals little else than downright meanness and cantankerousness. The theater has often dealt successfully with the lives of insignificant people whose will to conquer life's conundrum gives them heroic proportions. But in Sweet and Sour, small people remained small and slapstick and almost heavy-handed humor were used to capture the viewer in lieu of real depth of character or situation.
