RO Firm Appoints Local Man

Appointment of John Aldred as chief engineer was announced today by Sherman Products, Inc., Royal Oak. He will work with H. F. Froehlich, group manager responsible for the manufacturing, engineering and purchasing-production control departments.

A native of Denver, Aldred brings a widely diversified engineering background to the new position with Sherman, world's leading manufacturer and distributor of tractor-mounted earth moving, soil preparing and ma-

terials handling equipment. Holder of BS and ME degrees from the University of Colorado, Aldred also has 18 hours of graduate work in theory of elasticity and mathematics. He joins Sherman after six years as chief engineer for Hills-McCana of Chicago, manufacturer of valves and pumps, where he headed an engineering staff of 25.

FROM 1945 until 1952, Aldred was chief designing engineer for A. R. Wilfley & Sons of Denver, specializing in centrifugal pumps

primarily for the chemical-mining and metallurgical industries. During the war years he was in charge of control systems for Consolidated Vultee Aircraft Corp. at Fort Worth and San Diego. Upon graduation from the University of Colorado in 1936, Aldred gained his first industrial experience with Wilfley, where he returned after the war to develop the product line and introduce it to the foreign market.
