at the Society of Arts and Crafts in Detroit, will show oils and gouache paintings. Water colors by Rosamund of the U of M will also be included.

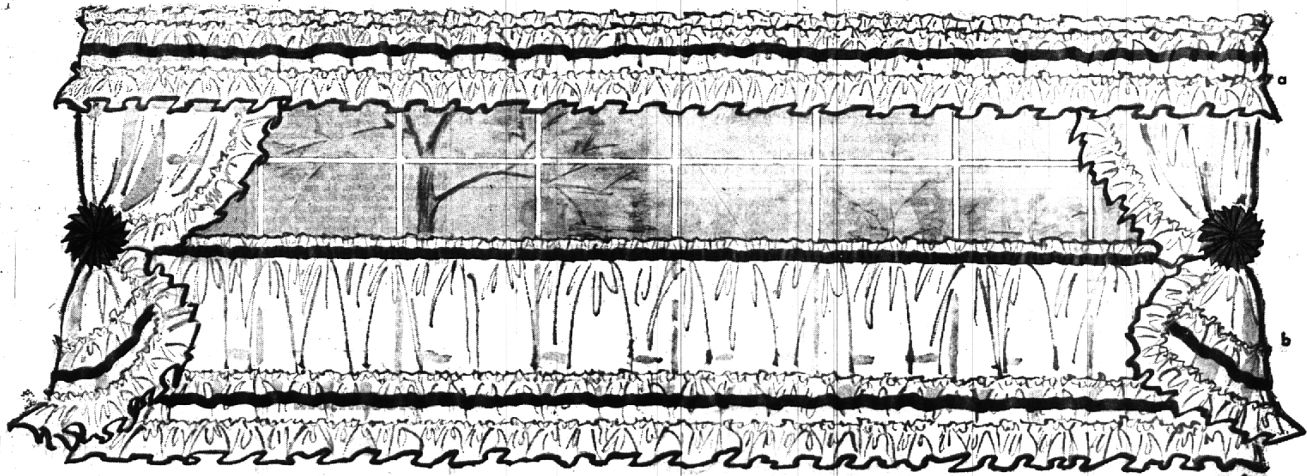
