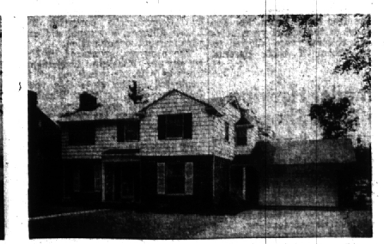

SOUTHFIELD - The Michigan Liquor Control commission has notified Mayor Don Swanson that no new licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises shall be issued in newly incorporated cities until the next federal census. Southfield will have to wait until after 1960 to establish a license quota. Licenses are issued for bars and taverns based on 1 license for each 1,500 of population.
