B'ham Schools Build New Service Structure

Birmingham students will find several new improvements and additions to the school system when they return to "the grind" this fall.

Prime on the list is the \$50,000 service building, located at Lincoln and Eton road. The structure will provide space for bus repair and storage of part of the school system's 35 buses. A pipe shop for school heating system repairs is also housed in the building.

Two other maintenance buildings already are located on the school district's two-and-a-half-acre site. The new structure, designed by Architect Linn Smith of Smith, Tarapata, MacMahon, Inc., was included in the bond issue approved by voters in June, 1957.

BALDWIN elementary school renovations include a new roof, re-

placement of deteriorating brick and masonry on exterior walls, a change-over from coal to oil heat and other miscellaneous items.

The work was completed during the summer and did not appreciably change the building's appearance. Total expenditure for the improvements was \$123,345.

Heating changes were made in the Bloomfield village school, the access road to Derby school was paved, and the interior of Birmingham high school was repainted.

Backstops at the play areas of Midvale, Valley Woods, Harlan and Greenfield schools also were installed.

New Bus Routes Not Fully Planned

A reshuffling of school bus scheduling for the Bloomfield Hills district is being planned for this fall, based largely on the separation of junior and senior high school buildings.

A spokesman for the district said it will be late in August before final plans for the new setup are announced.

The Birmingham school district plans lesser reorganization of its schedule, which also will be announced late in August.
