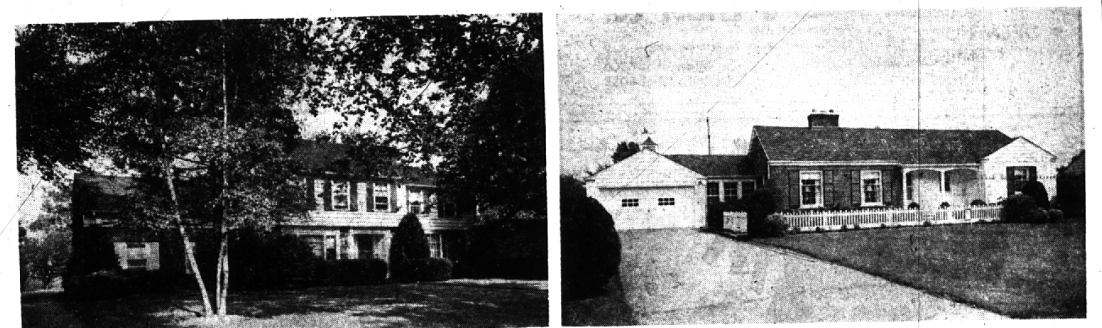

It's Westward Ho for Explorer Scouts

Philmont Scout ranch near Cimarron, N.M., is the destination of eleven Explorer scouts of post B-29, Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, who left last Saturday, accompanied by Frank Schuck, chairman of the Explorer scout committee. Explorer scouts taking the trip are Mike Murphy, Jim Bindo, Henry Lewandowski, Bob Cumming, Carl Ludwig, Terry Roach, M. T. Kelly, Nick Schek, Bob Neff, Jim Brain, and Doug Pooock. The boys earned the money for the trip selling Xmas wreaths and doing odd jobs. Two weeks ago, they had a shake-down at the DA Ranch to practice what they had learned and to test-carry packs. They will spend twelve days at Philmont, the first two receiving instruction in camping skills and listening to the historical background of the area and the story of the Waite Philip's gift of Philmont to the Boy Scouts of America. The next ten days, the boys will explore the 127,000 acres comprising the rugged western country on the slopes of the Sangre De Cristo range of the Rocky Mountains which comprise Philmont. They will hike and camp in an area made rich in history by ancient Indians, Spanish conquistadores, American trappers and mountain men like Kit Carson. They will climb mountains and mesa, inspect ancient Indian writings and old mines and the timeb record of geological rocks.
