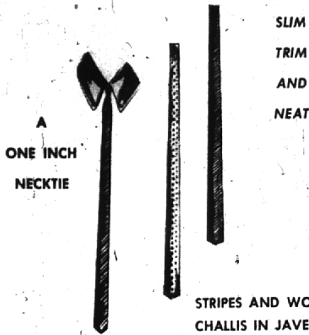


Junior Club Meets
