Bingham Farms Residents Told to Cut Blighted Elms

BINGHAM FARMS—Following a village survey of elm trees in Bingham Farms this past month, residents are told removal of contaminated trees is a strictly "do-it-yourself" problem.

Councilman James McGuire reported to the council Monday night that about a dozen property owners have been advised of blighted trees. He recommended they make private contracts to have them cut down and burned within ten days. The village has neither the equipment nor man-power to undertake removal, he said.

The council is studying Birmingham's ordinance for control of the blight and has asked its attorney to prepare a draft suited to Bingham.

Trees bearing red tags have been condemned. Those with yellow tags with numbers indicate that samples of bark have been sent to state laboratories for testing.

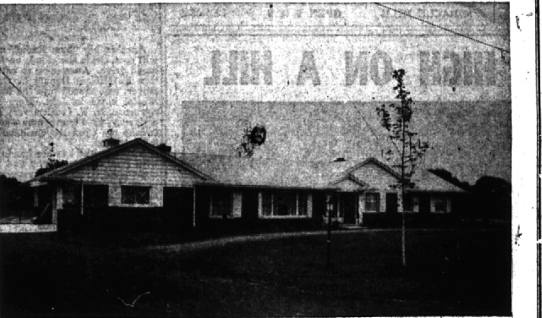

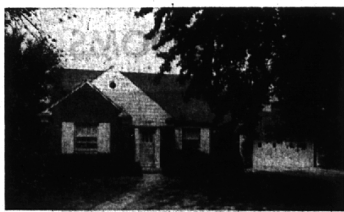
