Miss Mensing won a first for the best advertisement for a local business in business management; fifth for best overall performance in editing; and honorable mention for best prospect analysis in business management.

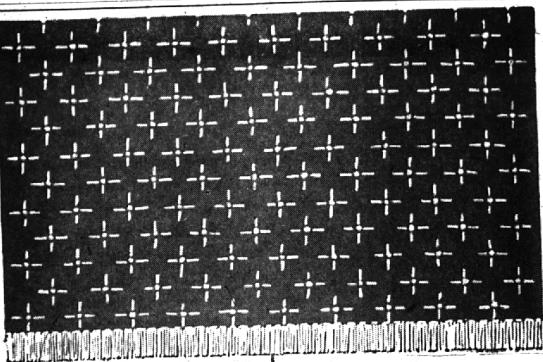
