WESTWOOD—The village council Monday tossed cold water on swimming pool owners in Westwood.

Councilmen set a deadline for getting fences around pools and ordered the safety department to be firm about filling pools from fire hydrants.

Over the protests of Chester Guilmet, pool owners were given until Aug. 31 to contract for the fences required by the new ordinance and until the end of September to get them built.

Alerted by Southfield's action last week to ban filling new pools from hydrants, the council raised the question for Westwood.

Deputy village attorney Tom Dillon surprised the councilmen by informing them that they had already passed a law to that effect. Dillon pointed to section 6, 2a, of the nuisance ordinance where it says "no person shall tamper with, injure, deface, destroy or remove various things including fire plugs.

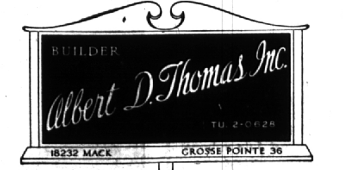

The provisions of Swimming Pool Ordinance No. 16, Section 4.01 with respect to a "reasonable period" within which to comply with the requirements of said Ordinance, shall be construed to mean "30 Days from August 1, 1958; provided, however, that any person who has within 30 days after August 1, 1958 entered into a binding contract for the erection of a fence, which contract will be performed within 60 days from August 1, 1958, shall be deemed to have complied with the Ordinance."

Guilmet says he started the name change project because so many people favored Beverly Hills at incorporation meetings before the village was born. Westwood was originally chosen because it did not mention "Beverly," which appears in many subdivision names in the village.

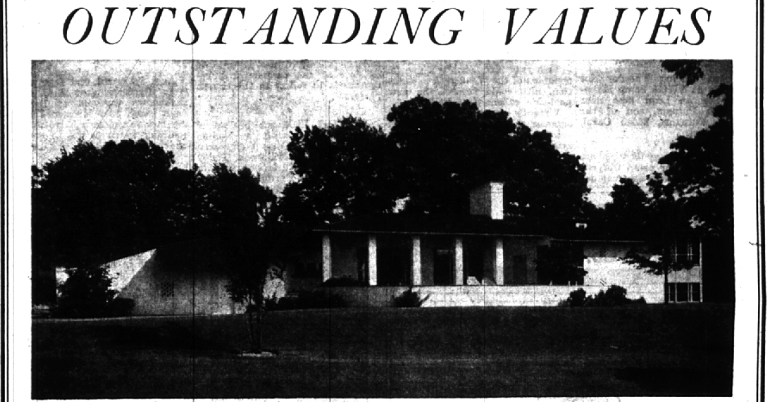

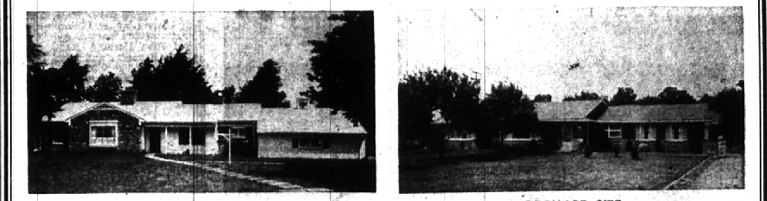
