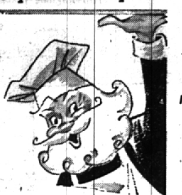

To Hold White Gift Services

Christmas can't be too far away as the time rolls around for the annual White Gift Services at First Presbyterian Church.

Designed to help make Christmas a real family affair, they afford an opportunity for all the family, tiny tot, teenager, parents and grandparents, to sing Christmas carols together.

Two services will be held Sunday. Families with small children may find it easier to attend the 5 p.m. service while those whose children are a little older can come at 7 p.m.

Some families will bring gifts of toys, clothing or food wrapped in white to be distributed through Presbyterian Neighbored Houses in Detroit to families in special need. Gifts of money will go to the Christian Hospital, Hamadani, Iran to buy medicines for poor families.

At the conclusion of the service the families will come forward and lay their gifts at the manger. As they leave the church the head of each family will receive a lighted Christmas candle. This is to be lighted each night up to Christmas as the family worships together.

This year some fifteen high school juniors, looking quite unlike themselves because of colorful attire or bearded face, will act out the Christmas story in pantomime while the familiar words are read from the Scriptures.

The scenes will be interspersed with music from the 55 10 and 11-year olds in the Chapel Choir at 5 p.m. and from the 55 junior high girls in the Cecilia Choir at 7 p.m.

This Pastor Knows What's Going on

Rev. Donald G. Zill, pastor of Beautiful Saviour Lutheran church, believes a minister ought to know what is going on around him in this scientific age.

That's why he has a masters degree in botany from the University of Michigan, and a bachelor of science degree in biology from Capital university, Columbus, Ohio.

Mr. Zill said he wasn't sure what he wanted to do when he first started college. It was either science or the ministry. So he combined them, and did a little "botanizing."

"These days people expect a minister to know something about everything. Some people even expect you to know everything about everything," he said.

A native of An Arbor, Mr. Zill attended the U of M for two years and then transferred to Capital university.

HE RECEIVED his B.S. degree from Capital in 1953 and continued his studies for four years in the seminary school.

He attended the U of M between his seminary terms, received his masters degree from there on 1956 and graduated from the seminary in June of 1957.

After serving his minister's internship at St. Pauls Lutheran church, Michigan City, Ind., he was interim pastor at Good Hope Lutheran church in Pennsylvania.

BEFORE COMING HERE in September, he spent a year as religious instructor at Capital university.

He and his wife, Caroline, whom he met at the Lutheran student center at the U of M, live at 3828 Normandy, Royal Oak. She is a graduate of the nursing school at the U of M.

Since arriving here to replace the Rev. H. J. Kuhlmann, first pastor of the two-year old church, Mr. Zill has been a busy man.

CHURCH ATTENDANCE has almost doubled. He has 70 communicants and 100 baptized members. His work day includes a morning at the office, house calls in the afternoon and special meetings at night.

He is presently preparing a Sunday school Christmas program and spends one night a week rehearsing with the choir he formed.

"I usually try to take Mondays off to squeeze in one night a week at home," Mr. Zill said. "Pastors just never reach a point where they can say 'I'm caught up.'"
