The wedding will take place in June.



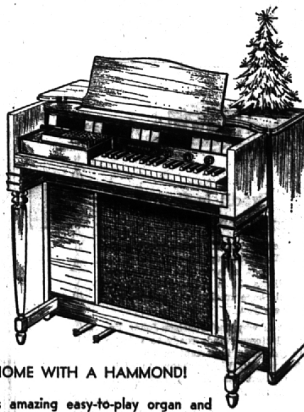
