## Parents Assured Of Southfield Schools' Safety

SOUTHFIELD—Reassuring anxious parents alarmed by the recent Chicago school fire, Glen Schoenhals, superintendent of Southfield public schools, says everything possible has been done to make Southfield schools safe.

Each time additions are made on any Michigan schools, plans are checked in Lansing by the state fire marshal, and later inspected. All Southfield schools have been inspected for fire safety in recent years, Schoenhals said.

Will J. Oliver, school board treasurer told the board that one of the system's oldest schools, East Southfield, has the lowest fire insurance rate because of its construction of fireproof materials.

Schoenhals also remarked that chire has been taken to see that new additions and new schools are without blind ends where children can be trapped.
