## 'What Am I Bid?' Gets No Answer At Lathrup PO

LATHRUP—When the deadline for bids on the Lathrup post office came around last week, there was a single bid to open. Lathrup's busy little post office stays where it is handling 3,000 to 3,500 pieces of mail daily, in spite of its non-conforming use of the House-in-the-Woods.

Postmaster David Redwood says postal inspectors are surprised and pleased at the amount of mail passing through his office, and in all probability new requests for bids will soon go out.

The postal department seeks to lease a building from a private investor who would construct it and rent it to the U.S. post office. Redwood blamed the high cost of property available in Lathrup for the lack of bidders on the post office offer.

## Lathrup Approves Gas Franchise

LATHRUP — A \$7 per cent turn-out of Lathrup's 2,100 registered voters approved the Consumers Power Company gas franchise last Wednesday, 805 to 85.

Requiring a 60 per cent approval of votes cast, Hanson Hedgecock, district manager for Consumers, said he was very pleased with the more than 80 per cent approval.

According to Hedgecock, Consumers will begin running gas lines into Lathrup early in the spring. The new A & P store located at 12 Mile and Southfield and conveniently near existing gas lines, will be the first new building, under the franchise, to be given Consumers service.

## Franklin Gets Initial Report On City Status

FRANKLIN—The village council heard an initial report Monday night from a committee studying the advantages and disadvantages of city and village types of government.

Committee Chairman Richard Kern read paragraphs from a Municipal League manual setting forth the legal duties of both bodies.

The committee was instructed to complete its study and make a recommendation to the council as soon as possible. The committee is also to determine steps, and time necessary to make a change of status, if it should be advisable, and appropriate expense.

Kern was asked to find out if a change from village to city would affect the sales tax refund and intangibles tax on a per capita basis, presently financing Franklin's tax-free government.

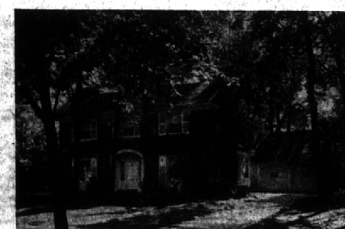

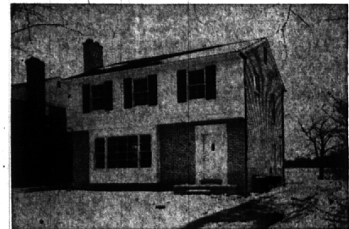

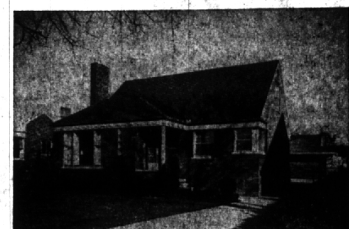
