Duck Hunting Hurt at P.M. By Low Water

Lansing, Dec. 11.—Low water levels have reduced hunter success and participation at Pointe Mouillee state game area this season.

Pointe Mouillee has enjoyed a 12-year reign as one of the state's leading game areas in terms of hunter success.

Accessibility to duck hunting marshes has been made extremely difficult due to the shallow levels. Consequently, in addition to hunting ducks, hunters, this situation has discouraged many prospective sportsmen.

Statistically, 4,076 hunters have bagged 2,315 birds since opening day on October 1.

IT DOES NOT appear these figures will approach last year's in which 4,000 hunters registered a 2,677 kill. The season ended December 9.

However, normal Great Lakes water level fluctuations are expected to raise water levels in the marshes and restore at least a portion of this loss in waterfowl habitat and in hunter use and other recreations.
