## **Overseas** Assignment: Rome '58

"Overseas Assignment", the goal of reporters yesterday and today, also is a coveted experience for a photographer. A Bloomfield township man is the most resent Detroit newsman to win an overseas assignment. He is Tony Spinichief photographer for the Detroit Free Fress, which sent him to Rome recently to photograph Vatican City (below) and events surrounding the recent election of Pope John XXIII.

The Cardinal died in Rome only minutes before he was to have entered the Conclave. Spina had to get a new permit each day in each area of Vatican City before he could take a picture.
