Odle Named Editor Of Co. Magazine

Harry V. Odle, 6186 Worthington, has been named editor of Burroughs Clearing House Magazine—a unique and leading banking and

financial magazine. Odle, who has been senior editor of the magazine published by Burroughs Corporation since 1957, has shared in the editorial direction of the publication since 1938. He succeeds Henry J. (Dan) Boons, who is retiring.

ODLE HEADS a publication organization unique in publishing annals. In size Odle's "Clearing House" has a circulation of 110,000 copies monthly, exceeding that of the next four independent banking magazines combined. It carries more banking advertisement than any other financial magazine. The magazine—widely read in Birmingham—recently celebrated its 40th birthday.

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF BLOOMFIELD HILLS SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 2, COUNTY OF OAKLAND, MICHIGAN:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election will be held in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, on Monday, December 8, 1958, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, for the purpose of voting on the following propositions:

I. Bonding Proposition

Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding One Million One Hundred Sixty-Two Thousand (\$1,165,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting and furnishing in addition to the junior high school building, a new elementary school building on the Quanton Road site and an addition to the Hickory Grove School Building in said School District?

II. Operating Millage Increase Proposition

Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2 for all purposes except taxes levied for the payment of obligations incurred prior to December 8, 1952, be increased as provided in Section 21, Article X of the Constitution of Michigan, by four (4) mills (\$4.00 on each \$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of all property in the School District for a period of three (3) years, the years 1959 to 1961, both inclusive, and by three (3) mills (\$3.00 on each \$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of all property in the School District for a period of three (3) years, the years 1962 to 1964, both inclusive, for the purpose of providing additional funds to meet operative expenses of the School District?

Each person voting on the above bonding proposition (Proposition I) must be—

- A citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age;
- A resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and of the School District for thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election;
- The owner of property assessed for taxes within the School District, or the lawful husband or wife of such owner;
- A registered elector in the city or township in which he resides.

Each person voting on the above millage increase proposition (Proposition II) must be—

- A citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age;
- A resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and of the School District for thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election;
- A registered elector in the city or township in which he resides.

The place of voting will be at the Vaughan School, 1060 Vaughan Road, Bloomfield Hills, Michigan.

THE POLLS OF ELECTION WILL BE OPEN FROM 7:00 O'CLOCK A.M. UNTIL 8:00 O'CLOCK P.M., EASTERN STANDARD TIME.
