Southfield city found itself facing a tight fiscal year and set the tax rate at five mills.

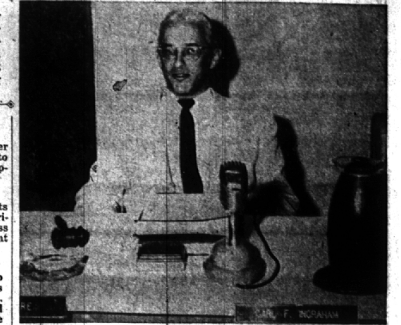
Babe Ruth and Little League officials submitted a special report to the recreation department listing their needs concerning maintenance of city playfields.
