Issue of Sept. 11, 1958

Bloomfield Hills city and planning commissions both drafted resolutions to the state highway department requesting the route of the planned Walter P. Chrysler expressway near Bloomfield Hills be relocated to avoid overburdening Long Lake road.

The state health department intervened in the much disputed 12-Town drain controversy and specified construction deadlines for the area. A health department order outlined starting and completion deadlines for the 12-Town and Dequindre drainage projects.

Issue of Sept. 18, 1958
