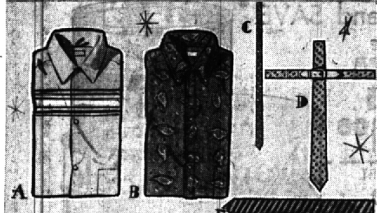
L. Robert Shesser, organist and choirmaster of the church will conduct.

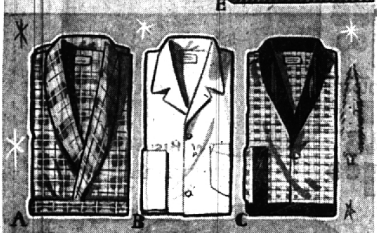

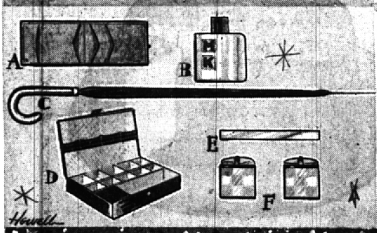

HE WAS MINISTER of music there for two years, and in November of 1951 he came here to the First Methodist church.

PETERSEN, like many other choir directors, is now in the midst of the busiest season of the year. Choir rehearsals, Sunday services and special programs keep him tied up seven days a week.

"I'll be lucky to have a day off between now and Christmas," he said.

There are eight choirs at First Methodist, composed of more than 300 members. Petersen directs five of the choirs and his assistant, Mrs. Mona Spezzano, directs the other three.

PRACTICES ARE HELD five days a week in Petersen's office at the church. He also holds two night practices a week for the adults.

"Some people don't realize the preparation necessary for choir programs," Petersen said. "Choir directors and members have to put in many hours practicing and preparing programs that will interest people."

"One wonderful thing is the way people will give up their spare time to come down here and practice for these programs," he added.
