Another important part of the program will be the presentation of the 'Fourth Wiseman' by Mrs. William Milligan. This will be a reading.

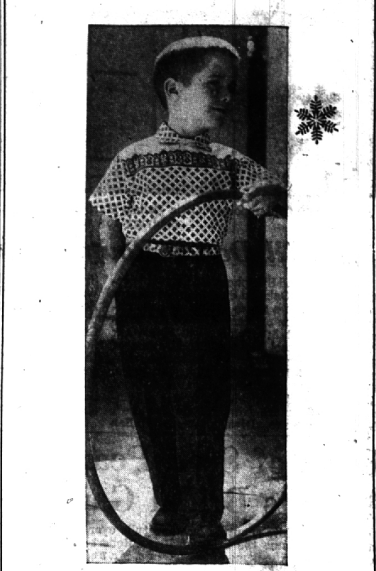
