

Winter Sports Areas Prepare for Season

A new recreation area and improvements and expansions amounting to a quarter of a million dollars to existing facilities will be available to winter sports enthusiasts in west Michigan during the 1958-59 snow fun season.

The new winter sports center, increasing the west Michigan total to a record 24, is Nub's Neb, located five miles northeast of Harbor Springs.

Features of the new area, which represents an initial investment of approximately \$150,000, will include four ski runs, ranging up to 4,500 feet, double chair lift and chalet with accommodations for 48 skiers.

Other improvements in the popular 31-county winter sports section, according to a survey by west Michigan Tourist and Resort Association, include new skier lifts, additional ski runs, expanded sleeping, eating and parking accommodations and enlarged snow machine coverage.

BOYNE Mountain Lodge in Boyne Falls, one of the top 10 ski resorts in North America, has completed the largest expansion project in the west Michigan area. The Mountain's \$125,000 program included installation of a 2,250-foot double chair lift, brought in the midwest, expansion of its ski machine to cover two-thirds of its ski area and lengthening of 7-bar and 4-bar lifts.

Cabaret, west of Cadillac, the midwest's largest and most diversified ski area, spent \$60,000 for the approaching season to expand its snow machine, cafeteria and rental shop, to widen runs and construct a new 150-car parking lot.

Harbor Highlands near Harbor Springs will complete an \$80,000 lodge for the 1958-59 season. Lodge improvements since last season total approximately \$85,000.

As a sophomore, he jumped at an opportunity to join the student manager's staff and is now the senior manager with five assistants.

As chief manager of the team, Jerry receives a partial scholarship for his work and also gets the opportunity of traveling with the team and meeting new people.

Deer Kill Up By 10 Per Cent

LANSING, Dec. 4.—Recent Conservation Department traffic surveys figured supported an earlier deer kill trend and reaffirmed a pre-season estimate which forecast a 10-15 percent increase in over-all kill.

The antlerless quota is estimated to jump by one-third over the 14,900 total in 1957 while buck kill may rise 5-15 percent.

Southbound cars have totaled 10,190 deer across the Straits; almost 1,000 more than the final figure in 1957.
