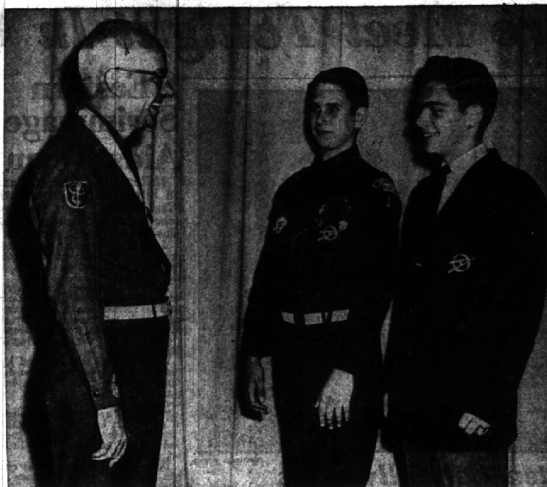
The conference, held Dec. 4th and 5th, was designed to demonstrate that reading is not confined within the boundaries of skill or technique.

ROCHESTER—Opening of Michigan State University—Oakland is still nine months away, but requests for applications and information about this new school continue to pour in each day.

"And we are getting mail inquiries not only from the Oakland-Macomb area, but from other Michigan cities as well," reports Roy J. Alexander, MSU-O director of student affairs.

More than 20,000 of the new MSU-O brochures have been distributed to interested students and parents in 38 Michigan cities, Alexander estimates.

"We have also answered inquiries from California, Florida, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, South Carolina and Texas," he adds.

TO BETTER acquaint students, teachers and administrators with the merits of this new center of learning, Alexander is visiting with public high school officials in Oakland and Macomb counties. Information brochures and applications are being left with high school counselors for student use.

MSU-O will open in the fall of 1959 for a freshman class only. "Sister" school to Michigan State University with its own administration and faculty, the college will offer four-year undergraduate programs in Engineering Science, Teacher Education, Business Administration and Liberal Arts.
