## Note Holiday 'Slip-Ups' to Ease Rush

Next year things will be different. We'll be ready for the holidays. This is a familiar refrain for most families. Extension specialists in home economics at Michigan State University suggest that homemakers use this Christmas season to plan for the next.

For instance, there's the old question: "Did I plan, shop, make gifts and send cards early enough?" Last-minute planners are often so busy they don't realize that their feelings of pressure, excitement and irritability are communicated to their families.

YOU CAN START planning right now. Make your 1959 gift list before the holidays end. You'll be less likely to overlook someone and can also watch for late winter, spring and summer sales.

How is the children's attitude this year? Are you planning your time so that you may help the children participate in holiday activities without losing patience and without the children becoming irritable and over-excited?

Participation in pre-season activities can help a child drain off pent-up excitement. But time, help and materials are needed. Parents should plan to have on hand a good supply of the things their children will need to make and wrap their own gifts and to create their personal Christmas cards.

FOR THE LITTLE child, this means flat crayons, paint, drawing paper, colored construction paper, scissors with blunt ends, paste and Christmas stickers—all preferably his own. You can also save "used" wrappings, cards and ribbons from this year's gifts. Label a box "Johnny's Christmas Box" — Open Dec. 1, 1959, and use it for collecting various items during the year.

For your own "research" watch how Christmas day itself goes. Did you plan for a peaceful enjoyable day, then have things go wrong? Now is the time to jot down suggestions. In fact, why not have everyone contribute ideas on how to make "next year's" one of the best yet. Tuck the list right in with your box of Christmas decorations and you'll have a good start toward a Merry '60.

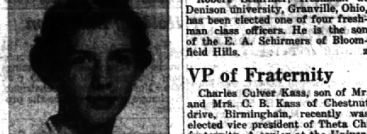
## Erdmann Elected Vice President
