He was the principal speaker at a luncheon meeting in Detroit where several hundred teachers of the Metropolitan Detroit Social Studies club gathered for a whole day's session of meetings around the theme "Keeping Democracy at Work." Lt. Governor Philip A. Hart had addressed the morning meeting.
