A REQUEST from Bloomfield Center Association, Inc., to have Barbours Terrace in the multiple-dwelling zoning district rezoned to business-professional use was referred to the planning commission. Robert J. Stadler, city clerk and treasurer, reported that 79 per cent of the county and school taxes had been collected. This contrasts with 73 per cent at this time last year. Residents have through Feb. 28 to pay these taxes at the city office. After that they must go to the Oakland county treasurer's office.

A program of vacation and fringe benefits for policemen, firemen and all other city personnel was presented by Stadler and approved. It provides three-week vacations after 10 years' service and six holidays annually.

Faulty installation of a smoke pipe on an oil furnace was blamed for producing carbon monoxide which nearly overcame a Birmingham woman shortly after noon Feb. 5.

Birmingham Fire Marshal George S. Scott determined the source of the fumes which sent Mrs. Phillip J. Hennelery, 1008 Bennaville, to William Beaumont hospital for treatment. Firemen said Mrs. Hennelery complained of severe headaches before they were called.

For the second time in two and a half months, Birmingham city commissioners denied a request for a property outside the city to be connected to the city sewer system. Commissioners said it is against city policy to extend municipal services outside city limits.

Milton Freeman again had requested a temporary connection so he could develop the southeast corner of Pierce and 14 Mile, in Westwood village.

His petition said the connection would be only for about a year and a half, until the proposed Evergreen sewer interceptor is constructed.
