Latest in Series

This is the seventh in the "History of Medicine" series of paintings for Parke-Davis by Robert A. Thom, 6160 W. Surrey, Bloomfield township. It depicts Hippocrates, Greek physician of the fifth century and known for 2,000 years as the "Father of Medicine."

Bloomfield Residents  
Pose for Thom Painting

The artist-writer team preparing 40 oil paintings for Parke-Davis depicting the "History of Medicine," has visited museums and interviewed authorities on two continents to insure the accuracy of each. However, models for the paintings—which are circulated throughout the free world—are usually residents of metropolitan Detroit and Michigan.

Hippocrates, Greek physician of the fifth century and known for 2,000 years as the "Father of Medicine," rubs a young patient as a concerned mother anxiously awaits the diagnosis in the seventh painting of the series.

Model for Hippocrates, George W. Barton, is a retired pharmacist who lives with his family at 6160 W. Surrey, Bloomfield township. The concerned mother is Mrs. W. Calvin Patterson, 6155 E. Surrey, Bloomfield township, wife of a Michigan Bell Telephone Co. vice president, and her son, James is the patient.

ARTIST ROBERT THOM, neighbor of the Bartons and Pattersons, and Parke-Davis' George Bender, editor of the series, say authenticating antiquity in a painting is perhaps more exacting than doing research for a history book. Bender said, "Therefore, every detail that goes into such painting must be accurate before publication." Including clothing, jewelry, hair styles and even bone structure.

For example, models in paintings about medicine in ancient Egypt and India were Egyptian and Indian students at the University of Michigan. He said Mrs. Patterson was almost eliminated as a model when preliminary sketches of her were sent to authorities for approval.

"SOME QUESTIONED whether her high cheekbones indicated Nordic rather than Greek ancestry. Two of our important sources, however, agreed that the woman as painted was representative of a Grecian lady of the period. They were John Young, professor of art

Chaosology at Johns Hopkins university, Baltimore, and Dr. Elias Zaphos, New York City, personal secretary to the ambassador of the Greek republics of North and South America," Bender said.

17,000 Children Awaiting Help at Guidance Clinics

Dr. William Kelly, assistant director of the Michigan state department of mental health, says waiting lists for Michigan's child guidance centers now total 17,000 children.

Kelly was keynote speaker at last week's annual dinner meeting of the Oakland child guidance clinic and its branches in Birmingham and Oakland.

"It costs taxpayers 55 cents per day for treatment of a child at a guidance center," Kelly said. "It costs \$4.50 per day to house them in a mental hospital. We are saving this price for creating such a clinic."

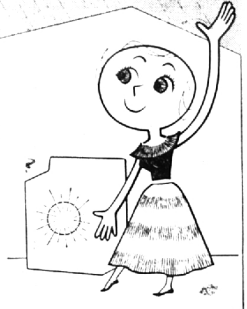
