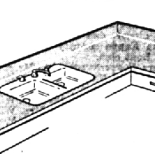
Have You Met...

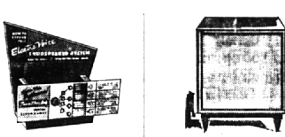
Have You Met...
