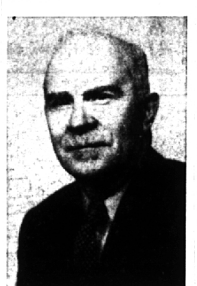

At the conclusion of the competition, refreshments will be served by the Jorgens Unit.

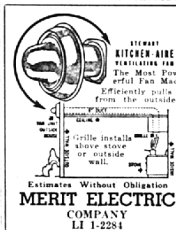

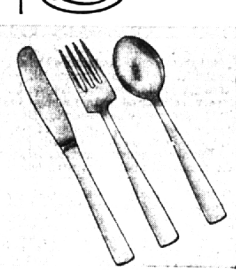
