




Grinnell's New Birmingham Store



French-Made Car To Be Sold Thru Suburban Motors

Suburban Motors Co., Inc., 565 S. Woodward, Birmingham, will be the area distributor for the French-made Simca automobile.

Richard A. and Carl F. Fischer, partners, made the announcement this week. They also hold the Oldsmobile franchise here.

Said Richard Fischer, "With the influx of imported cars on the American market, the Simca is a welcome addition for the person desiring a quality automobile which has been proven over the years."

The Simca obtains more than 30 miles a gallon, according to the Fishers.

They said their agency will stock a complete line of parts and accessories. Several models of the Simca are now on display at Suburban Motors.
