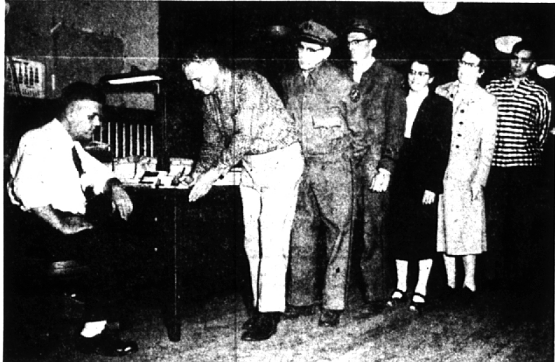


Downtown Offices Burglar Hits Four

This troupe with such luminaries as Dame Margot Fonteyne, probably the world's finest ballerina outside Russia, Michael Somes, Svetlana Beriosova, Rowena Jackson, Nadia Nerina, and Brian Shaw gave their audiences not only a superb dancing but also wonderful entertainment.

In music of Beethoven, Vivaldi, Bachler, and Villa-Lobos, this group displayed extraordinary musicianship in both classical and modern idioms.

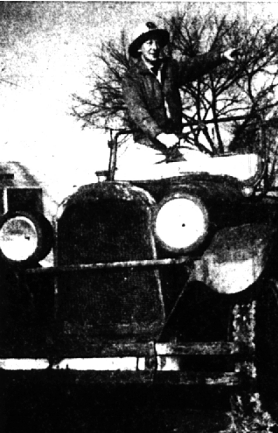
Miss Freeman played dynamical, and lyrically in the "Grand Manner," and showed herself to be a young artist with fully matured powers of technique and interpretation.
