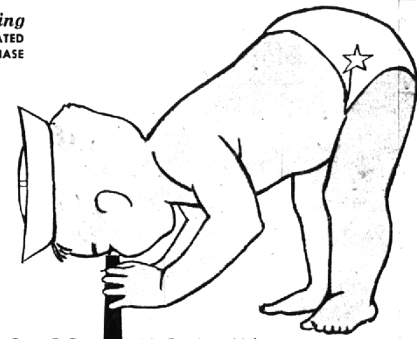
Troth Announced At Sorority House

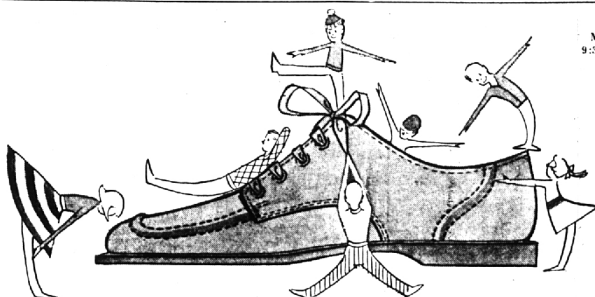

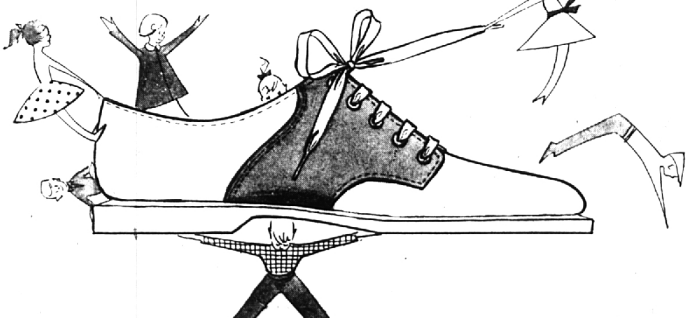
