

Child Clinic Sets Date of Annual Meeting

The Oakland child guidance clinic and its Birmingham branch and South Oakland branch will hold their annual dinner meeting at Northwest Inn, Thursday, Feb. 19, 8:30 p.m. Reservations can be made at the Oakland child guidance clinic, 113 Franklin Blvd., Pontiac.

Speakers will be Dr. William H. Kelly, assistant director of the Michigan department of mental health. His subject will be "What Can a Community Expect of a Child Guidance Clinic?"

Other plans include comments from Miss Madeleine Half, clinic director, and presentation of board nominees by the nominating committee, of which Dr. Robert J. Mason is chairman. Mrs. Edwin B. Clark and Mrs. Max Miller are in charge of dinner arrangements.

PARTICULAR note will be made of the progress made in Oakland county this year with three clinic offices serving its residents. The main clinic at Pontiac completes its fourteenth year, while the Birmingham branch marks its second anniversary and the South Oakland county branch finishes its sixth month. The increased service being offered to children with emotional and personality problems living anywhere in Oakland County will be highlighted.

The clinic is supported jointly by the State Department of Mental Health, the Oakland County Board of Supervisors, the United Foundation of Detroit, the Pontiac Area United Fund and the Avon Township Community Chest.

The Birmingham Branch is currently supported mainly by the Junior League of Birmingham. The South Oakland Branch is presently financed by school boards of South Oakland county, as well as many PTAs and other social and fraternal organizations.
