DESIGNED primarily for the living or family room, the Living Room Speakerphone could almost pass for an attractive cigarette box on a coffee table. The small, compact set operates like the conventional hand-free Speakerphone, found mostly in business establishments, with its separate receiver, and with its transmitter and dial enclosed in a glistening white and gold case.

THE BELL BUTLER is made up of a small speaker-transmitter mounted next to the front or back door. It allows the homeowner to answer the door by "remote control" from any telephone inside the house. After simply flicking a button at the base of a nearby phone, the homeowner picks up the receiver and talks directly with the caller.
