Vaughan school sounded more like a factory than a school last Friday when nearly 60 Bloomfield Hills school teachers attended a science workshop there. The all-day event, held on the end-of-semester holiday, was conducted by Dr. William Forbes, science consultant with the Oakland county board of education. Mrs. Kay Flint, supervisor of instruction for Hills elementary school, arranged for the workshop on electricity. Dr.

Forbes talked to the teachers briefly, demonstrating devices helpful in teaching principles of electricity. Then the teachers went to work cutting, hammering, drilling the materials Forbes supplied. They made electromagnets, answer boards, galvanoscopes and other devices to show students how electricity reacts. Almost every teacher in the four Hills elementary schools participated.
