**DOWN TO EARTH**

**Here's How to Make Coal Grow**

There are tricks throughout the year to show young people so that they can enjoy gardening and here is an idea from West Hartford, Conn. An old fashioned dish garden.

Secure a shallow dish, or a small fish bowl will do, and place in it several lumps of coal. Next prepare a mixture of equal parts of water, salt, bluing and ammonia. Add a few drops of mercurochrome for color. Pour this mixture over the coal and sprinkle a few drops of mercurochrome over the coal. Beautiful fungus-like growths will result. It sounds to me like a wonderful experiment for a classroom with an opportunity to study the chemicals involved.

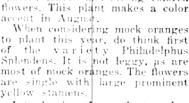
You never stir the mixture after the magic dish has been established and only renew the effect by adding more of the fluid when "the show" begins to fade. This idea was sent to me by an 8-year-old boy, but I am sure all ages would enjoy trying this novelty. I am the gal you will see in the coal yard picking up nuggets.

**IF YOU HAVE** a steep hill on your property which puzzles you for maintenance as it would take a mountain goat to scale the embankment, you might like to solve the problem. Like the Stanley Longs on Oka and drive. Boulders were spared in the embankment to hold the hill several feet apart, and fast growing jumpers were planted, but even then. The spreading roots of those jumpers help solve the erosion problem, the boulders will attain a diameter of ten feet and cover up the large boulders eventually.

**THE YELLOW** calla lily is another plant, grown from a bulb, which gives character to a sunny spot with its green and white spotted leaves and strong colored flowers. This plant makes a color accent in August.

When considering mock oranges to plant this spring, think first of the variety Philadelphia Sibiricus. It is not leucy, as are most of mock oranges. The flowers are simple with large prominent yellow stamens.

Introduction of new plants makes this field a threat for those who like to grow and grow with the years.
