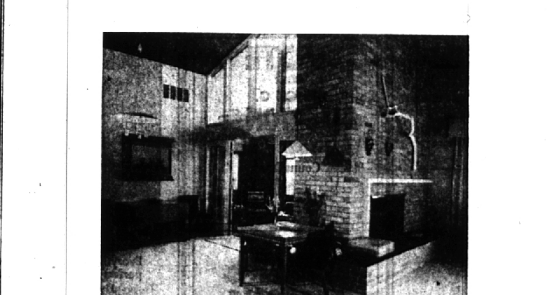

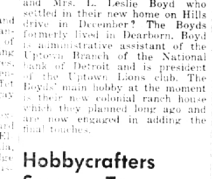
Hobbycrafters Sponsor Tea

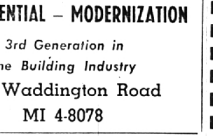
