

WALNUT LAKE — Dr. John Phelps and Dr. Fredrick Marroff, both of the Walnut Lake area, will present a program of music by Michigan composers at the Trinity Methodist church 12100 Woodward avenue, Feb. 9 at 4 p.m.

Dr. Marroff will play two of his own organ compositions and Dr. Phelps will present three. One of the highlights of the program will be a song cycle "Autumn Scenes" by Professor John Matthews of Kalamazoo where to date he has given a nationally known string quartet and two transcriptions from classical repertoire which have been used in Dr. Marroff's composition "Prelude on a Polka Tune".

The program is similar to that of the National Federation of Music clubs of which Trinity Methodist is a member.

Dr. Phelps is minister of music at Trinity Methodist church, Highland Park and Dr. Marroff is minister of music at Central Methodist church, Detroit.
