Chapter Picks B'ham Area Men

Talks to Architects At Cleveland Meet

A Birmingham area resident will help tell architects how to improve their estimates, at the American Institute of Architects national convention at Cleveland July 7-11.

Michael F. Kenny who lives at 18385 Bedford, Westwood, has been invited to take part in a panel discussion entitled "How to Make Better Cost Estimates."

KENNY OWNS a quantity surveying and estimating bureau in Detroit, and also teaches a class on commercial estimating at the Builders & Traders exchange, Detroit.

He recently completed a manual for the chief of engineers, U.S. Army, standardizing the estimating procedures to be used in all corps of engineers offices throughout the country, and he is under contract to write a book on quantity surveying.

Distribution Of Blue Book Under Way

The Michigan Bell telephone company began distributing its 1958 "Blue Book," the South Oklahoma county street address telephone directory, this week.

Features of the blue book are its three sections: the first section is the alphabetical listing of streets, covering the entire directory, with a corresponding column designating the community in which the street is located.

Next is the street address section in which streets are listed alphabetically, followed by the telephone user's name and telephone number. A separate section is provided for each community covered in the directory.

The third section contains the listings of telephone numbers, arranged numerically. Each listing is followed by the telephone customer's name.

A NEW FEATURE is the inclusion of several communities in the directory, including Farmington, Farmington township, Birmingham Falls, Westwood, and a part of Novato township.

This year's blue book lists approximately 116,000 business and residence telephone users, an increase of more than 13,000 subscribers, due partially to the new areas which have been added.

Included in the heading for each community will be the number of customer listings contained in that particular section.

The communities included in the directory in addition to those new areas mentioned above, are Berkeley, Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Blufffield township, Clawson, Ferndale, Franklin, Hazel Park and Huntington Woods.

IN ADDITION, it includes Lathrop Village, Madison Heights, Oak Park, Pleasant Ridge, Royal Oak, Royal Oak township, Southfield, Troy and West Bloomfield township.

Similar blue book directories are published by Michigan Bell for Detroit, Grand Rapids and South Macomb county.

MJA Executive Contest Winner

Charles F. Campbell, media executive with MacManus, John & Adams, Inc. was among the winners in an automotive industry contest sponsored among advertising people by Popular Mechanics magazine.

Although Campbell, 1773 Stanley, Birmingham, came within 200 units of the actual 1,119,000 cars registered during the first quarter of 1958, his effort brought only third prize—a \$30 check.
