The only answer received from the company regarding maintaining the old schedule was that they "are losing money."

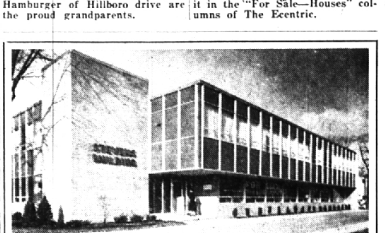
If they are forcing people to drive their own cars or find other means of commuting, it is no wonder they are losing money.
