

Zoning, Traffic, Nuisance Laws Wait for Action

WOODCREEK FARMS—Zoning, traffic and nuisance ordinances were discussed at great length by Woodcreek's council last week, but failed to get a citation pending changes and further study.

A zoning ordinance, submitted in time by the planning commission headed by Watson Kinney, was deferred until the R-3 code was changed to permit lots no smaller than those already in existence. Proposed minimum lot size is 20,000 square feet while to date the smallest existing lot is 27,500, and most are considerably larger.

A FEW UNKEMPT yards in the mile square village are the target of council action to draw up a general nuisance ordinance to protect tidier neighbors. Councilmen will seek a citation pending that to Woodcreek's requirements.

FIRM measures will be taken with persons who fail to get building permits before starting projects, the council agreed. Two residents who have built without permits, and stop work orders will be issued unless they get them at once.
