Telephone Rates Up 10 Cents Per Month

The basic rate for residential telephone service here goes up 10 cents a month under the recent public service commission order granting Michigan Bell telephone company an increase in revenues. This rate applies to Midwest telephone users in Birmingham and Mayfair and Mulberry telephone users in Troy.

The 10-cent increase applies to one-party and two-party residential flat rate service. The charge for flat rate business line service is raised 25 cents a month. The four-cent message unit charge is increased to 4.2 cents.

Additional directory listings for business service are increased 25 cents a month, while additional residence listings go up 10 cents a month.

The \$1 charge for spring cords is eliminated in cases where a charge applies for other telephone work being done on the premises.
