

Cranbrook Lot Possible Site Of Fire Station

\$50,000 Blaze Destroys Lumber Storage Shed

SOUTHFIELD — A north-end firehall site may be bought and a police headquarters location was proposed by the Southfield city council at meetings Monday and Tuesday.

The council may take an opportunity made Monday by subdiviser Rodney Lockwood to sell the city a Cranbrook subdivision lot to use for a fire station. A price of \$200 was mentioned.

The city has been looking for a site for a fire hall in the northern section because the station on 13 Mile road is now in the Village of Westwood. Homes in the northern part of Southfield city now get fire protection from the 13 Mile road station under a temporary agreement among Southfield city and townships, and Westwood.

The biggest Southfield fire in five years destroyed a lumber shed at the C. M. Lumber Co., 21170 W. 8 Mile, early Monday morning.

Damage was estimated at more than \$50,000, according to the Southfield fire department. The structure was a total loss.

The blaze, reported by a neighbor at 12:57 a.m., was limited to 25 by 175 foot storage shed containing tar paper, mill work and stacks of lumber. The cause of the fire is undetermined, according to fire officials.

Three Southfield trucks, manned by five firemen, battled the blaze pumpers crew.

When they arrived, the building was engulfed in flames. The metal roof caved in, spreading the fire even further.

The Southfield fire crew finally extinguished the smoldering stacks of lumber at nearly 3 p.m. Tuesday.

The flames did not damage any other buildings on the premise. No one was injured.

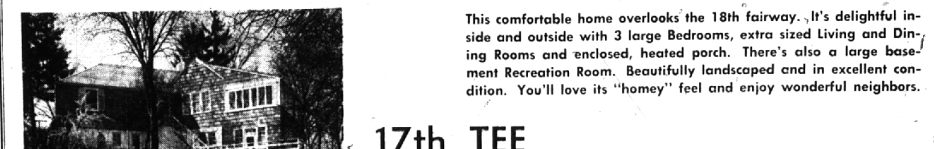
