

### Questionnaire May Further Road Study

FRANKLIN — A questionnaire, dealing with the cost and development of the Franklin village roads, may be sent to village residents to determine sentiment on the problem.

Councilman Don Hogue, chairman of the special committee to study the creation of assessment districts, attempted to accomplish this feat by a personal canvass. The result was nil, he told the village council Monday.

"People ask me so many questions I can't answer," he said, "and they give such a variety of answers to my questions that we're really not getting anywhere."

HE SAID the road issue was so complex that the residents had difficulty giving a clear-cut answer.

Councilman Edward Green suggested that a questionnaire bearing a classification of the type of local roads and the methods of payment might be more successful. He added that the forms could be mailed out.

Hogue also reported that village attorneys were working on a charter amendment to provide for bonding and the establishing of procedure for the creation of special assessment districts.

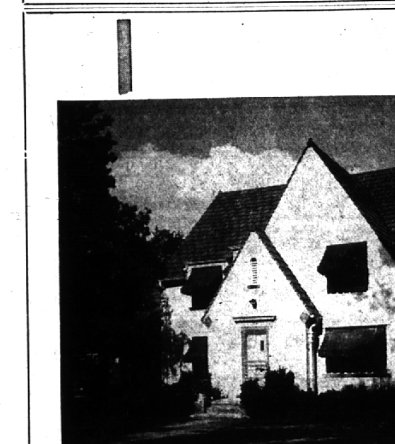
