He presented six lectures in the field of preaching. The conference was held on the campus of Aderson-Broadway college at Phillips to which the Rev. Dr. Robert A. Moseley, assistant pastor at First Baptist church, will go September first as assistant professor of religion.

Dr. Kontz's lectures included these subjects: "The Ministry of Preaching," "Resources for Sermon Preparation," "The Prophet and the Preaching," "Preaching and the Pastoral Ministry," "Preaching to Human Needs" and "Preaching and Reading Habits."
