Barones Announce Birth of Daughter

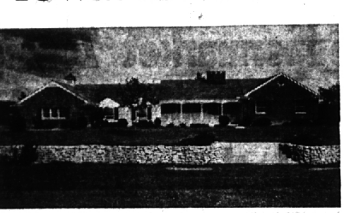

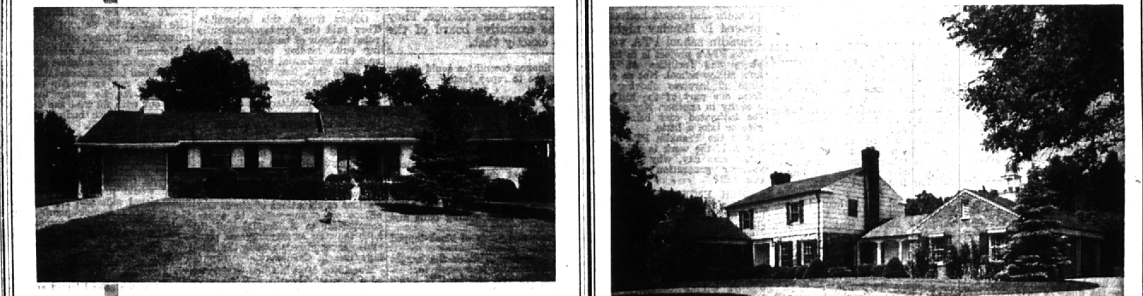
