The Peter Garwoods of Hersheyvale have returned from Higgins Lake where they spent two weeks.

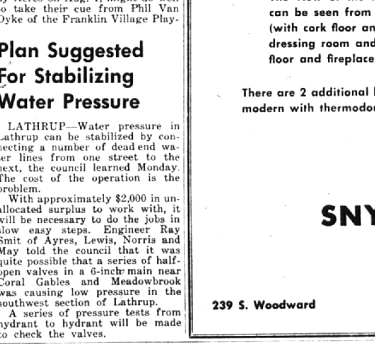

**Plan Suggested For Stabilizing Water Pressure**

LATHRUP — Water pressure in Lathrup can be stabilized by connecting a number of dead-end water lines from one street to the next, the council learned Monday. The cost of the operation is the problem.  
 With approximately \$2,000 in unallocated surplus to work with, it will be necessary to do the job in slow easy steps. Engineer Ray Smit of Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May told the council that it was quite possible that a series of half-open valves in a 6-inch main near Coral Gables and Meadowbrook was causing low pressure in the southwest section of Lathrup.  
 A series of pressure tests from hydroant to hydrant will be made to check the valves.

**Nose for News? Or, Eye for Excitement?**  
**Franklin — "Look!"**  
 That's what Dan Oberschulte's keen sense of observation continually urges.  
 It seems that Dan, son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Oberschulte of Franklin, recovered a government weather study camera from Lake Michigan last week, while vacationing with the family near Glen Arbor.  
 ROWING ABOUT 200 feet from shore, the 15-year-old youth spotted a white object bobbing in the water. At first he thought it was a dead sea gull, but discovered, as he rowed nearer, that it was mass of white material and lines.  
 Pulling the lines, Dan observed that it was a parachute. A package, wrapped in buoyant material, was attached to it.  
 The package had a notice printed on the outside that warned of danger and requested the finder to call government officials in Minnesota.  
 The Minnesota official told Dan, when he called, that the package contained a camera and equipment being used by the government to study wind drifts, cloud formations and weather factors.  
 THE CAMERA was sent aloft by the General Mills company, under contract with the government in a study of weather and weather-producing factors.  
 Since the cereal firm has been active in plastic research, the balloon building business was inevitable.  
 The Franklin boy was rewarded for shipping the parcel back to the government.  
 Dan made headlines several years ago, when he rescued an injured hiker, who had lain for hours in the deeply wooded ravine north of 14 Mile road near Dan's home on Colony hill.  
 The hiker had been calling for help but was unafraid until Dan, then only 11, heard his cries.  
 His mother jokingly commented, "I never know what Dan will turn up next."
