### Franklin Road Plan Gets Nod

FRANKLIN—By applying road drainage, a new water of rock-on, Franklin's village council aggressively proceeded Monday night to attack its number one problem—road drainage.

The council allocated approximately \$200,000 of major road funds to correct drainage conditions plaguing sections of Franklin.

Included in the areas are the north end of Wellington road, portions of Irving, Brandingham, Carol and Normandy roads, and a section south and west of the Franklin Community church. The new system will tie in with the present 24 inch county drain.

THE COUNCIL adopted the plan after studying an extensive, detailed report prepared by road engineers Hubbell, Roth and Clark and hearing recommendations by Daniel W. Barry, Oakland county drain commissioner.

The plan was one of two proposals submitted by the engineers. The other would have embraced a greater area, approximately 120 acres of the north end of Wellington road area was given priority since it serves as a hub community activity and traffic converging on the business section of Franklin.

ADOPTING PLAN number one will include the construction of 1800 feet of ditching and 18-inch drainage according to Stanley Hunter, village street administrator.

Dr. Aiken's Body Found Near Soo

Dr. Aiken and Richard Gardner drowned when their sailboat was swamped in bad weather. A third man, Marvin Mallis, was rescued.

Police were trying Wednesday to reach Aiken's widow, who was en route to California. Dr. Aiken lived at 2650 Appoline.

Becker was formerly with the U. S. Army in charge of sanitation, Hilo, Hawaii.
