to understand how the student feels and reacts. It is the teacher who possesses these qualities who changes a class from a mere lecture-hour into a period of interesting and profitable learning.

After you have evaluated yourself in terms of native characteristics and ability, the next thing to consider is your education. Good high school and four-year college education are obligatory.

WORKING FOR A masters degree is not necessary, but it can be helpful and important in your future teaching career. In most states, you will be required to take some practice teaching courses along with these. This, of course, is a helpful thing. But don't be fooled into thinking that education courses alone can make you into a teacher.

A good teacher has both a solid knowledge of and a sincere interest in his subject. Being familiar with the subject you plan to teach is far more important than filling your college years with education courses. And be sure to consider the subject in all its aspects.

For example, if you are a history major, take several courses in political science and more in economics. Remember that many subjects are interrelated and that teaching history requires more than learning facts and figures.

ANOTHER IMPORTANT factor is to decide as early in your education as possible what age level you wish to teach. Different groups of students require different kinds of teaching, and your years of schooling can be pointed in a specific direction, saving you much back-tracking later on.

Thus, if you would be a teacher, and a good one, be sure you possess a keen interest both in your students and in your subject. And don't forget how to learn as well as to teach, for a teacher never stops learning as he grows and changes in a changing world.
